
Dr Gregory Makris

He is currently a senior fellow in vascular and interventional radiology at Oxford University Hospitals. In addition, he is serving as Chairman of the British Society of Interventional Radiology (BSIR) trainees committee as well

as the chairperson of the European Trainee forum under the auspices of the Cardiovascular and Interventional Radiology Society of Europe (CIRSE). Dr Makris is the main author of many peer-reviewed publications and book chapters as well as peer reviewer for many international journals including BMJ and Cochrane. A consultant neuroradiologist with a particular interest in neurointervention. He was appointed as a consultant at Imperial College Healthcare NHS Trust in 2011 and is neurointerventional lead. He did currently his general neuroradiology training in Cambridge prior to Scientific Neurointerventional commencing the Boston Fellowship in Newcastle-upon-Tyne, England. He also worked as a praticien attaché at the Hôpital Gui de Chauliac, Montpellier, France with a particular emphasis

endovascular therapies of the brain and spine.

Beyond his clinical responsibilities, Dr Lobotesis is an honorary clinical senior lecturer at Imperial College London and has produced a steady stream of peer-reviewed papers to date. His primary interests lie in new medical devices and technologies and he is currently involved in a number of research trials, with collaborative links nationally and abroad. He was recently appointed as the British Society of Neuroradiologists du Boulay Professor 2017-2018.


